

Hoko River Tree Farm Recreation Access Permits

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What types of permits are available?

There is only one type of permit available for property access. A permit is required for **ALL** access, including hunting, fishing, hiking, walking, and bicycling.

Motorized Permit (MP) – This is a seasonal permit covering the Permittee and family Companion use. Cost is \$325.00, and permits are valid from August 1 to December 31. Only 150 permits are available. The permit allows access for the Permittee and up to three (3) family Companions, defined as:

- One (1) designated adult Companion (parent, spouse, domestic partner, or adult child), AND
- Up to two (2) related minor children, under the age of majority, for whom the Permittee is legal guardian.

The adult Companion must also carry their own copy of the permit, which can be accessed at no extra cost through an invitation after purchase. Minors are not listed on the permit and must be accompanied by a permitted parent at all times.

Can I access Hoko River Tree Farm without a permit if I am using non-motorized access?

No. A permit is required for all access including hunting, fishing, hiking, walking, and bicycling.

When, where, how can I buy a permit?

Start at <https://cgrecreationpermit.com/>. To open or create account, follow the links to (MOA) My Outdoor Agent <https://myoutdooragent.com> and search for **CG - Hoko River** Tree Farm permits. Website charges for permit will appear as “**One Connect**” powered by Orbis.

What if Motorized Permits sell out before I purchase mine?

Permits are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional permits will **not** be sold.

What can I expect when I buy a permit online?

Permit allows access to the Hoko River Tree Farm property. After website purchase the permit will be in your My Outdoor Agent (MOA) account (<https://myoutdooragent.com>). You must download from the **License Agreement Tab** in your MOA account to **PRINT your copy of permit (with QR code)** and have it in your possession while recreating on the property. Be prepared to show your permit and photo ID when asked by law enforcement, security, or Campbell Global personnel. Permit is for the personal use of an individual, single family and is non-transferable. Single family means permit holder and his/her immediate family Companions (defined above). Adult Companion must also carry **their own permit** copy.

We will mail you a key and windshield stickers for your vehicle(s), etc. within 3 weeks of purchase. If you **do not** receive your packet within three (3) weeks of purchase, please contact Campbell Global at port.angeles.recreation@campbellglobal.com. You have six (6) weeks from date of purchase to notify Campbell Global regarding refunds or permit delivery. **No refunds or replacements will occur past 45 days from purchase.** Adult Companion will need to carry a copy of permit issued from their MOA

account. Failure to have windshield sticker on registered vehicle will result in immediate revocation of permit.

How do I add a second vehicle to my Motorized Permit?

Each Motorized Permit comes with two windshield stickers, allowing up to two vehicles to be registered. However, adding a second vehicle is *not required*. If you only plan to use one, you may leave the second blank. If you do plan to use two vehicles, **you must add both vehicles immediately after purchase** through your MyOutdoorAgent account.

What if I sell my vehicle or get my windshield replaced?

Your permit will come with two (2) windshield stickers. If you sell a vehicle or get a windshield replaced, you must remove active permit sticker. Stickers must be retained and are non-transferrable.

How do I add a Companion when I buy a permit online?

For adult Companion (defined above) to recreate on the property, they **MUST** be added in primary MOA account as a “member”. To complete the process, the Companion will need to create their **OWN account**, accept the membership AND print and carry their own copy of the permit (with QR code) while recreating. Minor children are not listed on permit, but must be accompanied by a permitted parent.

How does the permit work for families?

Each permit includes access for the **Permittee plus up to three (3) Companions**:

- **One (1) designated adult Companion** (a parent, spouse, domestic partner, or adult child), **AND**
- **Up to two (2) related minor children** for whom the Permittee is legal guardian.

Companions must meet the definition above. Minor children are not listed on the permit but must always be accompanied by a permitted parent. If a child is **17 at the time of purchase** but turns 18 during the year, they may still be included as the adult Companion.

Can I bring a friend?

No. The permit is for the exclusive use of the Permittee and their approved Companions only. It is non-transferable. Allowing others not listed on the permit to enter the property can result in immediate revocation of the permit.

How do I get to the property?

There are several points of entry to the property via forest roads off Highway 101 in the vicinity of Beaver, WA.

What about fire season?

During summer and fall, there may be periods of high fire risk due to dry conditions. To protect the property, it may be closed temporarily during these times. We will send out regular updates via text and email. Updates will also be posted at <https://cgrecreationpermit.com/>.

Can I ride my E-Bike, dirt bike, ATVs or snowmobile?

No. Motorcycles, ATVs, UTVs or snowmobiles cannot be on the property, even if they are street legal. Furthermore, they cannot be brought on property in the back of a pick-up or on a trailer. **No battery powered or pedal assisted e-bikes.**

Cutting firewood?

MOTORIZED: Firewood may be cut with an access permit when wood is available. Only down material from previously logged areas may be cut. NO standing trees may be cut. **Absolutely no cutting in areas of active logging.**

Can I hunt, fish, or trap?

Yes. All state laws must be obeyed regarding seasons, licenses, tags, and other regulations.

Can I target shoot?

No. Firearms are to be used for hunting during state-set hunting seasons only.

Can I build a campfire or cook over a barbeque?

No.

Can I cut a Christmas tree?

No. Cutting live trees is strictly prohibited for any reason, including Christmas trees

Can I pick berries and mushrooms?

You may pick berries and mushrooms for personal use only.

Is there special access for handicapped hunters?

No. Handicapped hunters are welcome to hunt during state hunting seasons with a recreation access permit. If the handicapped hunter requires an assistant to accompany them, the individual assisting must be registered on the permit as a Companion, in place of a family companion. (See **How do I add a Companion when I buy a permit online?** above.)

Can I purchase maps separately?

Maps are not available for purchase separately, but they can be **downloaded for free** to your mobile device from your **My Outdoor Agent (MOA) account** or through the **MOA Trax app**.

You'll use the **same login** for the MOA Trax app as you do for your MyOutdoorAgent account.

Note: Maps will not become accessible in the app or online until your permit is valid.

What if I lose my key or permit?

Lost or stolen keys can be replaced for a fee of **\$250**. Permits may be reprinted from your My Outdoor Agent (MOA) account.

Can we host an organized event on the property?

No. Permits are for **personal use only**. Any **organized or commercial activities**—including guided hunts, horseback riding events, cross-country runs, mountain bike races, or similar group functions—are

strictly prohibited. Using the property for commercial purposes may result in **immediate revocation** of your permit and could lead to being **permanently banned from future access.**

Can I use my recreation access permit to do research?

No. Permits are for personal use only.

What do I do with my key at the end of the season?

Keys are not reused and do not need to be returned.

What happens if I break the rules?

In order to maintain the privilege of using private property for recreational access, all permit conditions must be followed and are strictly enforced. If you are caught breaking the rules, your permit will be revoked at least for the remainder of the season and face the possibility of being banned.
